SAVE OUR SHORELINE APPLAUDS OHIO COURT VICTORY

Bay City, Michigan – December 12, 2007

Save Our Shoreline applauds Ohio's Lake Erie shoreline owners and the Ohio Lakefront Group, who yesterday won a class action lawsuit over title to the beaches and shores of Lake Erie. Judge Lucci of the Court of Common Pleas for Lake County, Ohio ruled shoreline owners, and not the state, own and have exclusive use of the shores of Lake Erie down to the water's edge. In its ruling, the Ohio court criticized the recent Michigan decision of Glass v Goeckel (which established a right of beach walking along Michigan's Great Lakes shores) as being "poorly decided."

"This is a great victory for Ohio shoreline owners, and is good news for shoreline owners everywhere," said Emie Krygier, SOS President. "If this decision is upheld on appeal, it will put pressure on the Michigan Supreme Court to give back our beaches that it stole from us in the <u>Glass</u> v <u>Goeckel</u> decision," he said.
